




The MedQuarter Regional Medical District is a central location for quality healthcare and services. The District is a revitalization partnership committed to promoting a dynamic urban medical community to improve quality of life and advocate for new businesses and jobs in a defined medical district.

The Cedar Rapids Medical Self-Supporting Municipal Improvement District (SSMID) is a result of the 2007 Downtown Visioning process. In 2009 several health care leaders in the area were approached about creating a Medical SSMID district. Under the Code of Iowa Chapter 386, a SSMID district must be a defined area within a city where properties are assessed an additional tax along with their regular property taxes to fund area improvements and services. These improvements and services are generally above and beyond the level of existing municipal services. SSMID funds can also be used to aid in the growth and revitalization of an area through administrative fees, marketing, paying off debt for the cost of improvements, or a combination thereof.


#### HISTORIC SSMID LEVY RATE

## **MEDQ**DISTRICT IMPROVEMENTS

SSMID funds are used to enhance the District over and above standard City service levels. To that end, the Cedar Rapids Medical SSMID has created both a Master Development Plan and a Master Parkway Improvement Plan to guide its District enhancement efforts. Many of these projects have been conducted in collaboration with the City to maximize the impact of the improvements both functionally and aesthetically.
